California's wildfire problem this year affects all of us, in a variety of destructive ways, and should be a wakeup call for everyone regardless of where they live - it cannot and should not be ignored. The number of wildfires so far this year has ALREADY exceeded the total number of wildfires on record for last year. Since last year, we have an ever-growing dismal snowpack, continued minimal rainfall, and new, record high temperatures with volatile fuels surrounding us. Therefore, visitors to California and CA residents need to step up and do their part to help solve the wildfire problem. State and federal efforts alone are not enough; it will take communities mobilizing in large numbers to topple this massive threat.

If you own property, you have a legal obligation to take preventive actions in order make your property wildfire safe. If you are a landlord, you bear the same responsibility and if you are a renter, you have a vested interest in protecting your neighborhood. We need to step in and help our disadvantaged neighbors who may face obstacles in protecting themselves and their communities.

The California Fire Safe Council works with all fire agencies, land managers, governmental agencies, non-profits, and the insurance industry to get our message out on how to make a difference. This starts with taking action and accepting personal responsibility to combat our mounting wildfire issue. Fire response agencies are committed to protecting us from harm as they respond to and suppress fire activity but are limited in scope and need the public's support.
